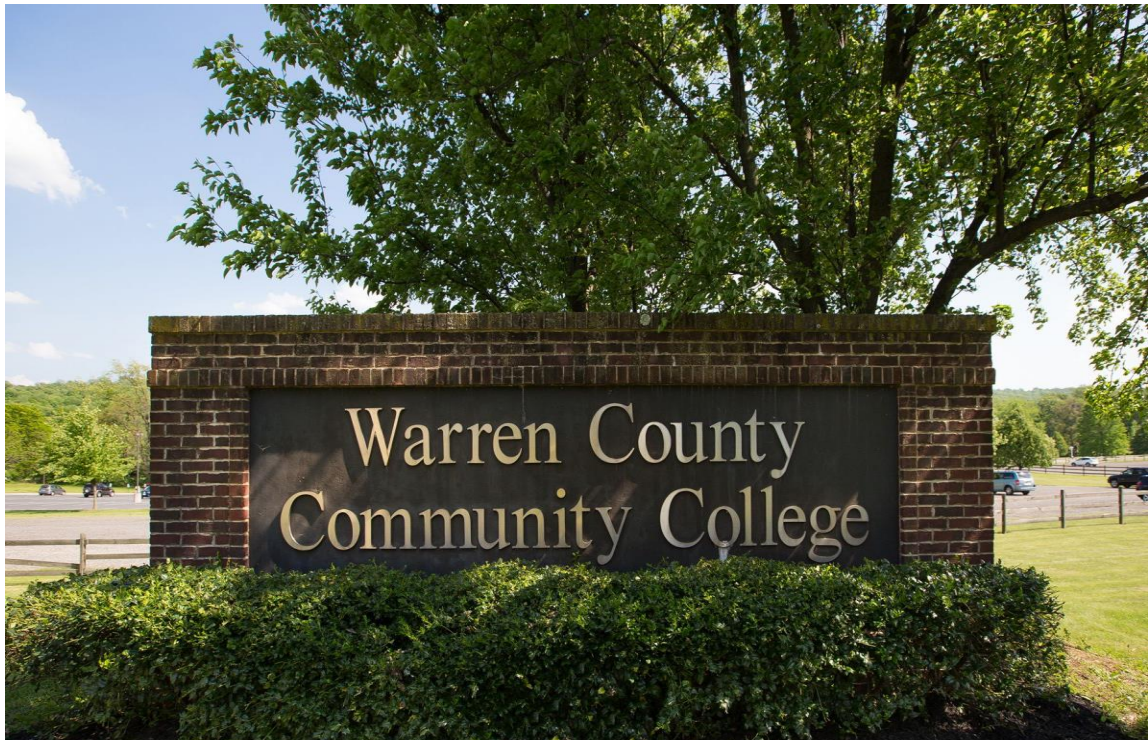

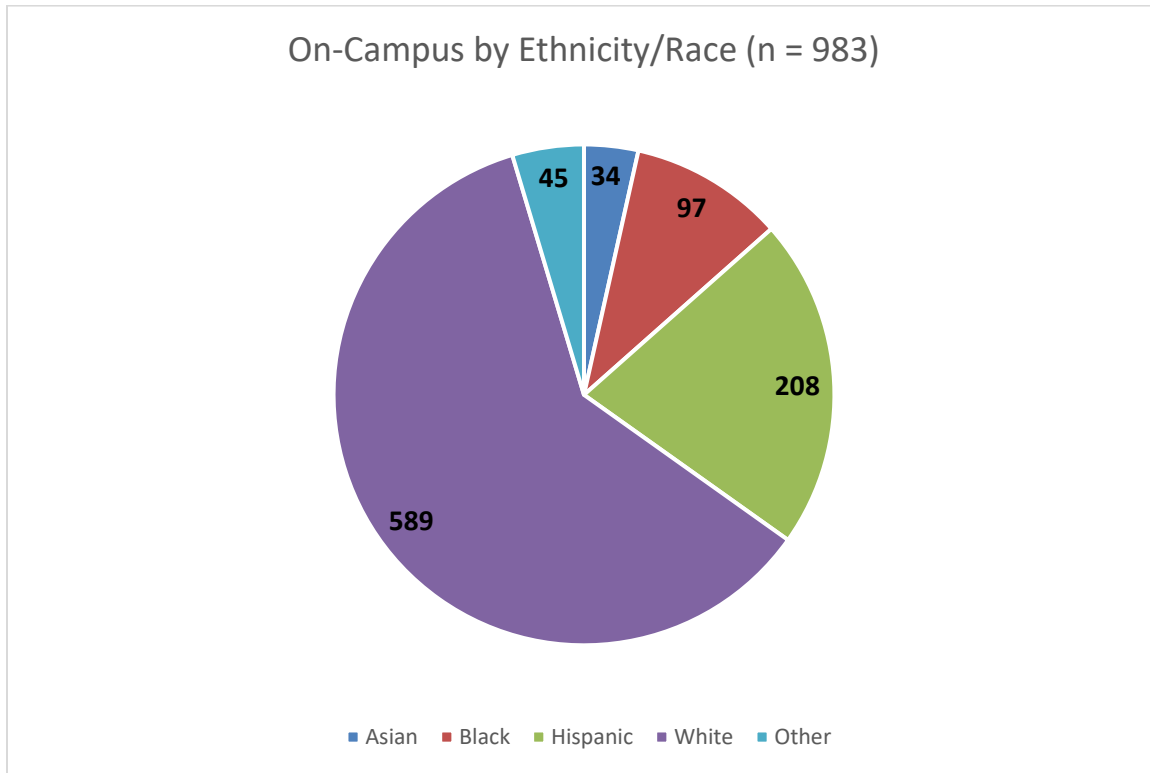


Figure 1. *On-campus Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity for Fall 2023*

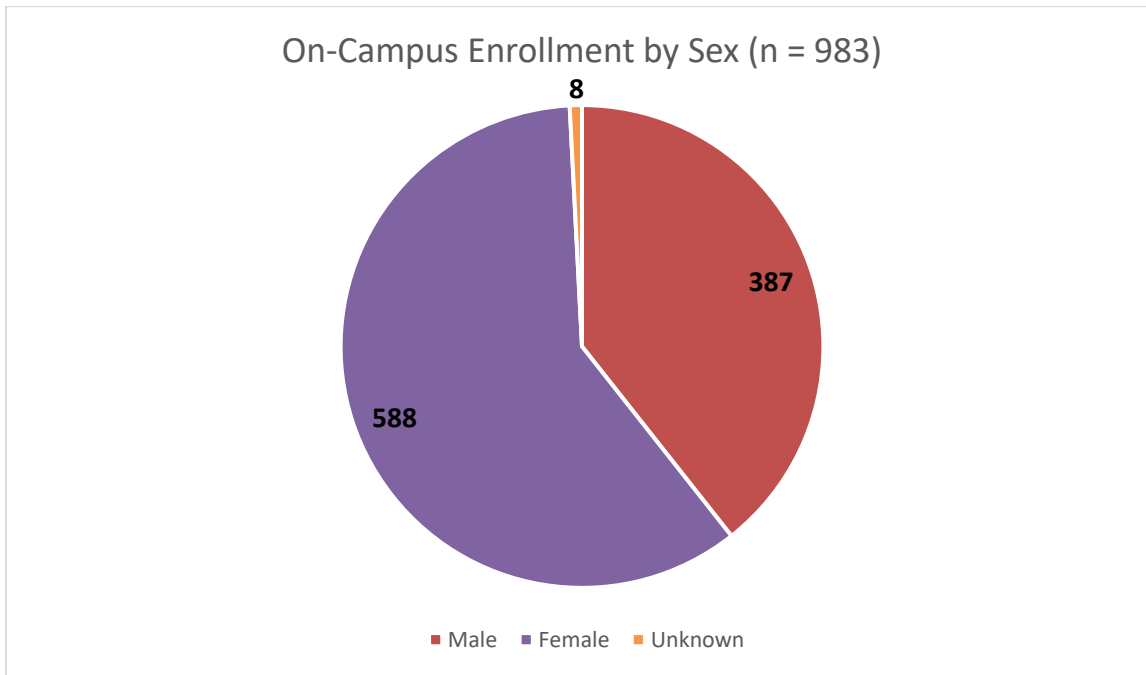


Figure 2. *On-campus Enrollment by Sex for Fall 2023*

3.c.1. On-Campus Enrollment by Age, Fall 2023

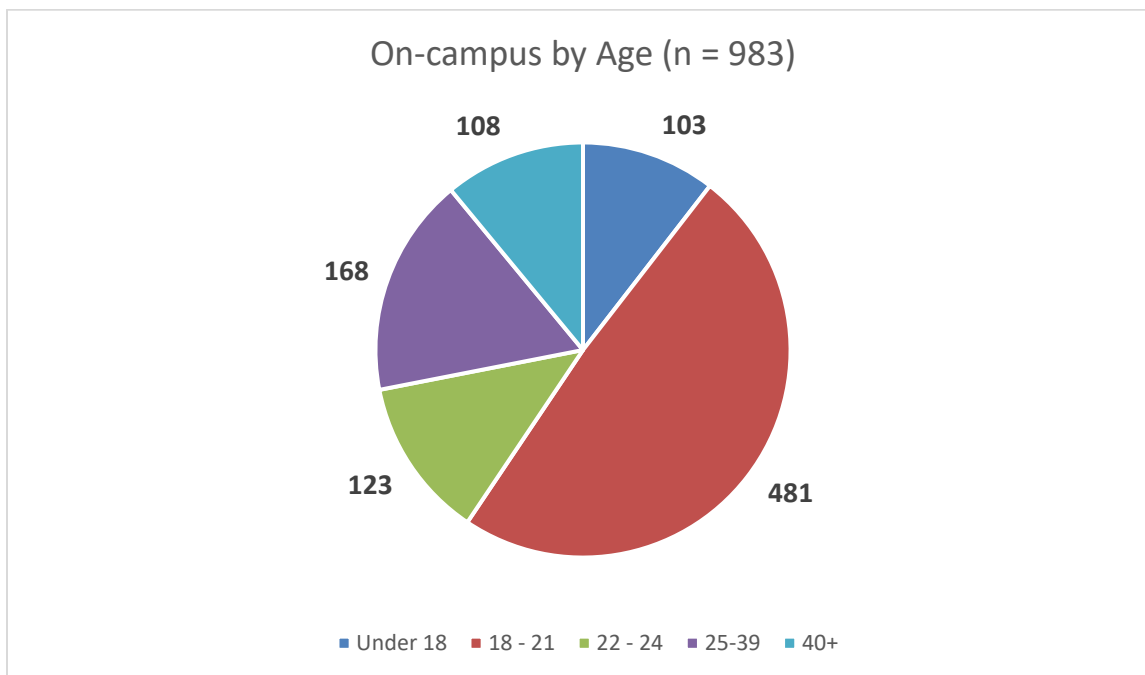


Figure 3. On-campus Enrollment by Age for Fall 2023

H. Major Research and Public Service Activities

WCCC's mission does not include research activities, however, the College does engage in a number of public service initiatives. Its employees serve on a number of non-profit organizations and WCCC has strong partnerships with a number of regional non-profit agencies. Our Division of Continuing Education also undertakes customized training to work with local businesses.

In August 2023, WCCC was awarded \$2.25 million Title III grant, covering a five-year period. The College has also submitted and expects to receive a \$699,000 Congressional Appropriation for a second Precision Agricultural grant in fall 2024.

I. Major Capital Projects Underway in FY 2024

WCCC was awarded a total of \$782,815 in Equipment Leasing Fund proceeds to support 39 Active Learning classrooms, replacement of library and computer laboratory PCs and some server room upgrades to improve wireless services for students.

In addition, the College has recently completed a memorial and contemplation garden adjacent to our walkway to honor members of our campus community.
